Social Concerns Committee

Reaching Up! Reaching In! Reaching Out!

Our GEM Easter Basket project for Social Concerns had a \$250 boost from Thrivent's "Giving Generously" program. Another \$250 was added to create a matching funds opportunity to "grow" our donations for our \$1000 goal. This would allow us to support 15 youth from the Union Gospel mission as well as supporting the Home Plate program in Hillsboro and Beaverton with hot meals and supplies they need to serve meals, provide personal hygiene products and other items that help support poor or homeless youth in Washington County.

It is exciting to be able to share that we exceeded our goal by \$300! This enabled us to add additional requests of large sizes of peanut butter, two kinds of jelly, Gatorade and bottled water for the mission. We also were able to support 18 youth from Union Gospel Mission with a GEM Easter bag that was age appropriate. These were delivered to the Union Gospel mission two weeks before Easter. Through our additional donations this enabled us to purchase a case of jerky and 18 adult back packs for the Home Plate teens program. Many of the teens that come through the Home Plate program are homeless and carry all they have in a back pack.

Volunteers purchased the items and more volunteers helped put all the baskets together after church. We had all ages of members having fun as we filled the GEM Easter Baskets. Several of our 3 years and under entertained us with their music and dancing.

GEM stands for Gap Essential Ministry and helps fill the needs of personal hygiene, school supplies and other items for people that are not covered by Food Stamps. This Easter we chose to support underprivileged and homeless youth. The spirit of giving and living generously shined through our members hearts as we were able to reach out and help more children this Easter.

Update – "Free the Sheep!" Campaign

We have continued to make great progress on our mortgage payoff campaign. Of the \$14,700 balance at the kick-off of the campaign, we are now down to \$5,200. Stewardship is maintaining a bulletin board measuring our progress in gradients of \$1,000 by marking a shepherd's hook like a thermometer and moving a paper sheep out of the pen and into the meadow. Each \$1,000 contributed is releasing an individual sheep from the fenced pen and setting the sheep free. To-date we have now freed nine sheep! Continue to watch the fun graphic in the entry way of the church – and remember, "Free the Sheep!"
